

DROP-IN POLICY

Teams are encouraged to take advantage of our drop-in policy. Rules of the drop-in policy are:

- A player who wishes to play, must register with the team that they are wanting to drop-in for by completing the drop-in form online and completing the online waiver. The drop-in player will need the team's drop-in pin code provided to the team representative at the beginning of the season. The drop-in fee is \$15.00 per game.
- Completion of the drop-in form, completion of the online waiver and payment of the \$15.00 drop-in fee is only MUST be done online. We do not accept cash for payment of the \$15.00 drop-in fee.
- A team can use a maximum of 3 drop-in players for a game, and there is no minimum roster number that a team is required to have in order to use drop in players (for example, if a team already has enough to field a team for a game, or even more than enough to field a team, they are still able to take advantage of the drop-in policy and have a maximum number of 3 drop-ins for that game).
- There is no maximum number of games that a team can take advantage of the dropin policy.
- A drop-in player can play for one or more games during the week of play as long as
 they complete the drop in form, complete the online waiver and pay the \$15.00 fee
 for EACH game they wish to play in. In the event the drop-in player does not
 complete the drop in form or complete online waiver or pay the \$15.00 fee for a
 game, the player will be deemed unregistered, and the team will be fined
 accordingly.
- A player who is registered in the league is able to drop in for another team as long as
 the team they are dropping in for is in a higher division than their own. A player
 registered in the league is not allowed to drop in for a team in the same division as
 their own, or in a division lower than their own.
- The drop-in policy excludes goalkeepers and female players. A goalie or female player, who is registered to any team in the North Shore Indoor Soccer League, can play in any game for any team and is not considered a drop-in player.
- A female player that is registered with a team in the league may choose to pay the drop in fee to play with another team. If the female player chooses to do this, she will be considered a drop-in player for that team, for that game.
- If a drop-in player has played with the same time three or more times in the season, they are able to be used as a drop-in during playoffs. During playoffs only, the drop-in

player will not be required to complete the drop-in form online, complete the online waiver or pay the \$15.00 drop-in fee.
